Identifying Multiple Access Points to the Curriculum Access points are the connections that make the content and concepts relevant to learners, whether through similar experience, or an interest, or tapping into their way of thinking. We have adapted the following structured reflection map from the work of Art Carolyn Brunner, the director of the International Center for Learning Styles at SUNY-Buffalo, sets out three nonnegotiables students must follow if they wish to alter planned activities in order to use their preferred learning styles: 1 the student's grades must either remain the same if they are already acceptable or good or improve; 2 the student's behavior must remain constructive and appropriate if it is already so or it must improve; and 3 the student's use of the
