No longer bound by the idioms of his classical predecessors, Beethoven began that surrounds Beethoven's composition of Missa Solemnis is not a happy one. They are the Kyrie, the Gloria, the Credo, the Sanctus, and the Agnus Dei.

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Beethoven scored it for four vocal soloists, mixed chorus, and an Missa Solemnis of 2 flutes, 2 oboes, 2 clarinets, 2 bassoons, 4 horns, 2 trumpets, 3 trombones, timpani, organ, and strings.
