Kellogg here falls back on his practice of quoting this important argument without any of the analysis and evaluation it deserves. Such interpretations became popular in the late nineteenth to early twentieth centuries, forwarded by authors such as Vladimir Solovyov, Pavel Florensky, Nikolai Berdyaev, and Sergei Bulgakov. One interpretation is that Socrates is wise because he, unlike the others, believes he is not wise, whereas the poets, politicians, and craftsmen arrogantly and falsely believe they are. *The Greek Search for Wisdom* is wise. Wisdom is not just one type of knowledge, but diverse. It falls prey to problems similar to those that refuted H1 both as an interpretation of Socrates, and as an acceptable account of wisdom. For example, it is appropriate to feel deeply sad when dealing with the loss of a loved one.
